### **Pink Patch Project Booth at the Los Angeles County Fair To Raise Funds to Fight Breast Cancer**

The Pink Patch Project is a collaborative effort between the Los Angeles County Police Chiefs' Association (LACPCA) and 40+ law enforcement agencies throughout the nation designed to increase public awareness about breast cancer and to raise funds for the fight against this disease.

The program centers on vibrant pink versions of the officer's uniform patches. Officers from the participating agencies will wear these pink patches on their uniforms during "Breast Cancer Awareness Month" in October. The pink patches are intended to stimulate conversation with the community and to encourage public awareness in the early detection and fight against breast cancer.

As part of this program, many of the agencies are selling their pink patches to the community, along with commemorative pink patch T-shirts, challenge coins and other pink patch items. Proceeds from the sale of these commemorative Pink Patch Project items go to fund breast cancer education, research, and treatment.

Beginning September 2<sup>nd</sup> through September 25<sup>th</sup>, Pink Patch Project volunteers will be manning a booth in Exhibit Hall #4 at the Los Angeles County Fair where they will display all of the pink patches from each of the participating agencies. Pink patches and related items from many of the participating agencies will also be on sale to the public.

We invite the public to stop by the Pink Patch Project booth in Exhibit Hall #4 while visiting the Los Angeles County Fair and join us in the fight against breast cancer!
